We want our students to become the best and most authentic version of themselves and provide a safe and nurturing place to do so. We guarantee small class sizes, classes based on skill level and interest (not by grade level), and a rigorous curriculum that strives to ensure students see the relevance and real world connections to their learning.

HOW DO WE DO IT?

We have a systemic series of checks and balances that is seamlessly built into our program, including hourly, daily, weekly, monthly, and semesterly rewards and consequences for student behavior. Our goal is to establish student accountability so they are not only aware of their actions, but can see the rewards and consequences of their behavior so they can make informed decisions.

WHAT DOES THE ENROLLMENT PROCESS LOOK LIKE?
